### **Short Report:**

The enemy can be very subtle in his attacks on a person's mind. Ms. LL was troubled with thoughts that if she was not perfect, others would getting hurt in some fashion. These thoughts caused her a great deal of anxiety, and she had not thought of the possibility that the source of these thoughts were evil spirits. She was referred to LFM by a friend, and was uncertain about what to expect. I did my best to ease the uncertainty, noting that I rarely guarantee anything was demonic. Instead, we approached it as if it was demonic and then addressed the spirit realm. If things got better, then we can know the problem was spiritual in nature. However, if things didn't get better, it can mean that we needed to go deeper into discerning the spiritual problem, or it isn't spiritual in nature after all. We went through the normal process of specifically confessing all sin that had not been confessed and canceling the ground any evil spirits may hold. After a couple of ministry sessions, things did get better for her, but wasn't quite great. At another session, we were able to get to the chief spirits that were instigating the problems: Crazy Thoughts and Sadness. The enemy subtly told her

that it was up to her to behave or else others would be hurt. Giving in to this lie allowed Crazy Thoughts to increasingly do just that: bring crazy thoughts to her mind. From that platform, the other spirits were able to contribute to her problems. Once the original lie was rejected and the ground cancelled, he had to go, and did so. Then all the demons were evicted in Jesus' name. I prayed a blessing over her of having a clear, sound mind. She seemed so relieved and at peace. A note sent at a later date confirmed she was free and doing well.

# **Something to Consider:**

**Isaiah 2:6**—<sup>6</sup> You, LORD, have abandoned your people, the descendants of Jacob. They are full of superstitions from the East; they practice divination like the Philistines and embrace pagan customs.

In the last few weeks, I have been able to watch a few Major League Baseball games. Also, I anticipate the coming football season. My experience with sports has reminded me of how superstitions are often a part of players' and fans' game day practices. In baseball, players won't step on the foul line or talk about a no hitter when a pitcher is throwing one. In football, fans will wear their good luck jersey on game day. Somehow, they want to bring good luck to their team and not jinx them.

By doing these things, how do people believe it is going to work? In reality, they are giving power to something in the spirit realm other than God. Ms. LL shows how superstitions develop. In order for something bad to not happen, or cause something good to happen, she had to be precise on her behavior. She couldn't trust in God to intervene, or reject the lie that she was responsible for such things. As is seen in Isaiah 2:6, superstitions are tied together with sorcery or witchcraft. The greater degree of sorcery or witchcraft, the more likely there will be superstitions in a person's life. Although many joke about such things and take them lightly, they really do create spiritual bondage for people.

If you sense that: you are bad luck, need to be perfect so bad things don't happen, feel that you must follow specific routines or rituals for protection, carry a particular item for protection or good luck, or even knock on wood so something bad doesn't happen, I encourage you to reject such notions. These things give power to the enemy to influence our actions. The more we listen, the greater power they have. You too can be free from these things as Ms. LL. Indeed, trust in God and live by His Spirit instead of trusting superstitious actions.

#### **Prayer Concerns:**

Please pray for me as this season is usually a time of greater intensity and quantity of ministry sessions.
